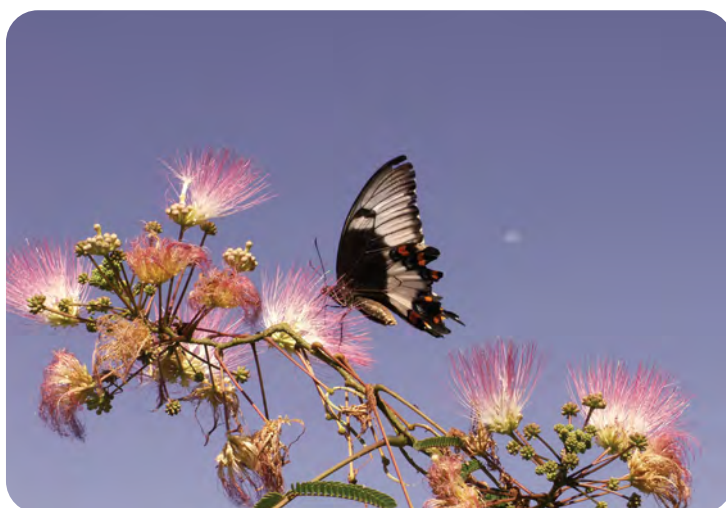

A-Z RALLY INFORMATION/

Code of Conduct



The purpose of the code of conduct is to set out the standards of behaviour expected of members when attending a CMCA rally. In agreeing to be part of the rally, each member must also agree to always adhere to these codes.

Members must:

- Treat all people associated with the Club, including members, volunteers, partners, and external stakeholders, with respect.
- Consider the welfare of the Club's members.
- Always be honest.
- Adhere to the rally rules established by the Club.
- Respect the immediate and local environment.
- Not intentionally or otherwise, damage the rally site, remove any equipment without permission, enter a restricted area, or promote any organisation other than CMCA, or act in a manner that may bring CMCA and/or its members into disrepute.

Uncooperative behaviour

- A member who becomes uncooperative, unruly or disregards the Code of Conduct, may be asked to leave the rally site.
- Failure to cooperate will result in the police being called to assist. If this occurs, further action via the CMCA Constitution may be undertaken and possible expulsion from the Club could occur.

COVID-19



The CMCA 35th National Rally will be run in accordance with all current COVID-19 restrictions and/or regulations in accordance with the relevant local, state and/or federal government authorities.

If you have symptoms i.e., runny nose, cough, fatigue, sore throat, headache, muscle pain, fever, or sneezing, you are to stay within your vehicle and notify first aid on 0409 305 288 who will then advise appropriate procedures.

Any member testing positive will be asked to move with their vehicle to the COVID Isolation area and remain in that area for the regulated quarantine time or as determined by the Rally Warden in conjunction with the First Aid Coordinator and Rally Manager.

Access to the quarantine area is restricted to the Rally Warden and the First Aid Coordinator who may from time to time authorise access to other members and/or volunteers to provide various services.

Generators



Generators should have a noise level not exceeding 68db.

- Generators must ONLY be run between 08:00 and 16:00 with **your neighbours' consent**. Generators must not be run for more than **two (2) consecutive hours** and for no more than **four (4) hours** per day. (Extended generator hours are available in a separate area of the Rally Site (08:00-19:00).
- If generators must be run outside the designated hours, then those members will need to consider relocation to a more appropriate site at the rally, after consultation with the Rally Manager.
- Members who insist on running generators outside the approved hours without the authorisation of the Rally Manager, may be asked to leave the rally.
- Vehicles can only be used to charge batteries with permission from the Rally Warden in consultation with the Rally Manager and/or the CEO. Permission will only be granted in emergency situations.

Clearing up the confusion about A Frame Towing

While companies claim that their products are compliant to specific design rules or regulations, they cannot claim compliance unless the products have been certified by the governing authority.

In the case of A-Frame Tow Devices, ADR 62/2 "Connections between Vehicles" defines what the design loads and testing methods are. The Australian Government Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communication and the Arts are the governing body for road vehicles through the ROAD VEHICLE REGULATOR (ROVER). ROVER integrates all applications and approvals under the new Road Vehicle

Standards Legislation

For an A-Frame towing device to be compliant it must be tested as outlined in ADR62/2 and then certified by ROVER.

Note that a designed component with or without Finite Element Analysis test cannot simply claim compliance with ADR62/2 because ADR62/2 calls for a physical test and the tested component must be certified by ROVER.

So Compliance is the standard and Certification is documentation that the component is compliant

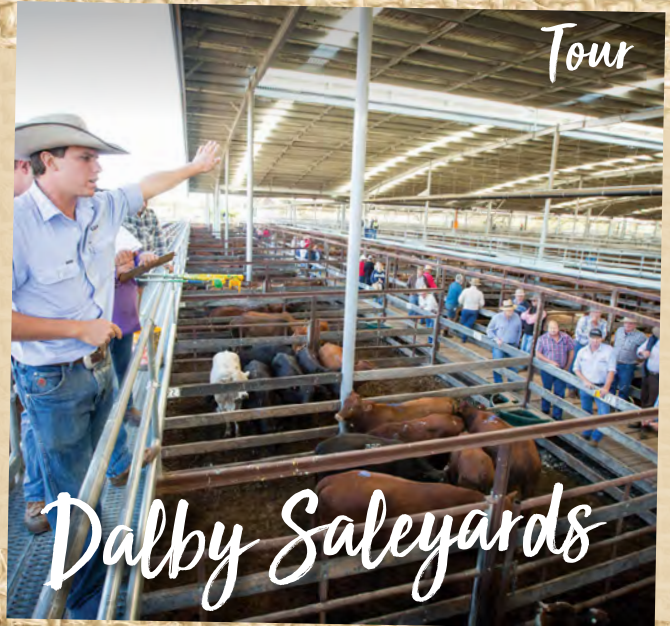
Parking secondary vehicles & tow vehicles



- Secondary vehicles must be parked in the designated parking area as shown on the Rally Site Map.
- Fifth Wheelers/Caravans/Campers – the primary (towing) vehicle must be in front with the hitch directly behind the vehicle when parked on your site. If you intend to use your primary (towing) vehicle to leave the rally site, please park in the designated secondary vehicle area on your return.
- A speed limit of **10 km/hr** applies within the rally site.
- Private vehicles must not be used to travel to other areas or buildings on site.
- Do not park where your vehicle could obstruct entrances, driveways or other vehicles.

Pets



- All pets must always be kept under control.
- All pets must be wearing a collar whilst in public and be micro chipped and registered.
- All pets must be on a lead no longer than two metres when in public places. Extendable/retractable leads are not permitted.
- Pets that tend to snap or bite should be muzzled when out of their RV.
- Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets.
- A maximum of two pets per RV is permitted.
- Owners must ensure that all pets are not annoying to other members, and should not be left for long hours unattended in RVs or motor vehicles, where they can cause a nuisance to neighbours and fellow rally attendees.
- All pets are prohibited from areas where food is consumed as well as from marquees, buildings, buses, and formal meetings and seminars etc. Guide and assistance (including companion) animals are exempt.

Powered Site Usage



Provided electricity can only be used for lighting, charging batteries, refrigerators and medical equipment only and not to be used for the operation of equipment such as air conditioners, heaters, hair dryers or multiple electrical appliances unless otherwise advised.

Power leads may be required of up to 30 metres in length and must be compliant to the Australian Standard AS/NZS 3000:2007 (Wiring Rules). Neither Rally nor CMCA Management will provide power cords unless for medical emergencies.

Only unaltered 15amp power cords are to be used to connect. No joining of cords allowed unless by an approved device such as an Amphibian which must be at least 300mm off the ground.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES/

Medical Emergency

- CALL 000
- Address is Bingara Showgrounds, Bowen Street, Bingara, New South Wales. Nearest cross-street is Bandalong Street.
- Then call first aid on 0409 305 288.
- Turn on your vehicle's hazard lights day or night and alert your neighbours. In the event of a caravan or fifth wheeler without a tow vehicle present, please have someone stand in front of the RV until assistance arrives.
- First Aid will contact the Rally Warden who will direct the ambulance to the required site.
- If you call an ambulance, you must ensure rally first aid is called straight away.

Fire and/or police emergency

- CALL 000
- Address is Bingara Showgrounds, Bowen Street, Bingara, New South Wales. Nearest cross-street is Bandalong Street.
- Then call the Rally Warden on 0400 333 095 or UHF Channel 50.
- Turn on your vehicle's hazard lights day or night and alert your neighbours if it is safe to do so.
- DO NOT move your vehicle unless instructed by the emergency services, Rally Warden, or Emergency Response Team (ERT).

If you discover a fire:

- R. Remove anyone from immediate danger
- A. Alert another person to raise the alarm.
- C. Contain the fire by closing up the vehicle, remove power lead and cut off gas.
- E. Extinguish the fire if safe to do so.

Gas emergency

- Turn off the LP gas container gas valve if safe to do so.
- Turn on your vehicle's hazard lights day or night and alert your neighbours if it is safe to do so.
- Evacuate the area for 30 metres around the leak (danger area).
- Call 000 or 112 (from a mobile phone) from outside the danger area.
- Contact the Rally Warden on 0400 333 095 or UHF Channel 50
- Post a sentry to warn passer-by of the danger.
- DO NOT move your vehicle unless instructed by the emergency services, Rally Warden, or Emergency Response Team (ERT).
- If cylinder catches alight, (via the pressure valve) spray water onto the top half of the cylinder to keep cool and then gradually turn valve off or let cylinder vent. (Make sure that in doing this you are not putting yourself in danger).

Emergency Evacuation

On arrival at your site, you should familiarise yourself with the location of all Emergency Assembly Areas. They are marked with a ★ on the [Rally Site map](#). Should an evacuation be necessary, proceed to the nearest and safest Emergency Assembly Area. You will be assisted by members of the Emergency Response Team (ERT) – please ensure you follow their directions.

Emergency evacuation and safety procedures are outlined on the Rally Noticeboards, and during the Member Orientation session on Sunday 20 October at 18:30 in the Whitworth Marquee.

Inverell National Transport Museum

Inverell’s National Transport Museum is open every day except Christmas Day from 10am to 4pm. With over 200 members and 120 vehicle exhibits, ranging from Vintage, Veteran, Classic and Motorcycles, the National Transport Museum has become a valuable tourist attraction for the North West and New England area. Some of the vehicles on display include a 1906 Dayton (believed to be the only one left worldwide), 1912 Renault, various Holdens and Fords including GT Falcons, 1926 Diana, 1929 Packard, and wide range of Chevs just to name a few.



TOURS/

Inverell Pioneer Village – Take a stroll through history

From the moment you walk through the magnificent gateway of the Pioneer Village, you immediately sense the history that surrounds you. The authentic buildings of the village have been collected from Inverell and surrounding districts and represent the lifestyle and pioneering spirit of our forebears.

Wander through the grounds to discover the Grove Homestead, dating back to 1840, it was originally located in Tingha during the height of the early tin mining days. It is the oldest building in the village and depicts the early settlers' homes. There is so much more; a visit will not disappoint.



Myall Creek Massacre and Memorial Site

This is the heritage-listed site of and memorial for the victims of the Myall Creek massacre at Bingara Delungra Road, Myall Creek, Gwydir Shire, New South Wales, Australia. It was added to the Australian National Heritage List on 7 June 2008 and the New South Wales State Heritage Register on 12 November 2010.

New England Woodturning and Sculptures

New England Woodturning Supplies was established in March 1993 and is owned and operated by Robert Day. The workshop, showroom and gallery are located on the Ponds Road Gilgai, opposite the Inverell airport, between Inverell and Tingha.

New England Woodturning and Sculptures

Set on four hectares of natural bushland, New England Woodturning Supplies is the ideal setting for many woodwork demonstration days and visits from woodwork and service clubs.

Ceramic Break Sculpture Park

This park is the brainchild of bronze sculptor, Kerry Cannon. The park features three galleries; the largest gallery boasts a mezzanine with an art library. The galleries exhibit both paintings and sculptures by Kerry and many local artists. There's also a sculpture walk and a bush walk which leads to "Ceramic Break".

Ceramic Break is an uninspiring rock mound where a participatory artwork is in progress. People are encouraged to bring a ceramic pot to the mound and break it!

Ceramic Break Sculpture Park opened August 16, 2003.

It is a relaxing place to appreciate art and enjoy the scenery of rural NSW.



Sawn Rocks

Sawn Rocks is located in the northern section of Mt Kaputar National Park and is undoubtedly the most iconic reminder of Kaputar's volcanic past.

The forty (40) metre high towering wall of pentagonal basalt pipes is the sheared off remains of a basalt lava flow from the Nandewar Volcano which dominated the area 21 million years ago.

It is an unusual phenomenon which is the result of the slow and even cooling of molten rock which enabled individual crystals within the rock to align perfectly with each other.

While this type of five-sided (pentagonal) 'organ piping' is not rare to lava flows, it is exceptionally rare to find them so perfectly formed and preserved and is recognised as being one of the best examples of columnar jointing in Australia.

TOURS/

The Rocky Creek Glacial Area is an amazing geological wonder, well worth the visit. But be warned, there is no ice and you will not find any of the typical glacial landform features, such as steep sided, flat bottomed, U shaped valleys that you might ordinarily expect. These landform features are the result of glaciers which existed during the last one million years, in Pleistocene Epoch.

The Rocky Creek glaciation is very much older, dating back some 290 million years to the Carboniferous Period. A vast amount of weathering and erosion occurs in over 200 million years, so all the original glacial landscape features have been eroded away and replaced by those typically associated with running water.

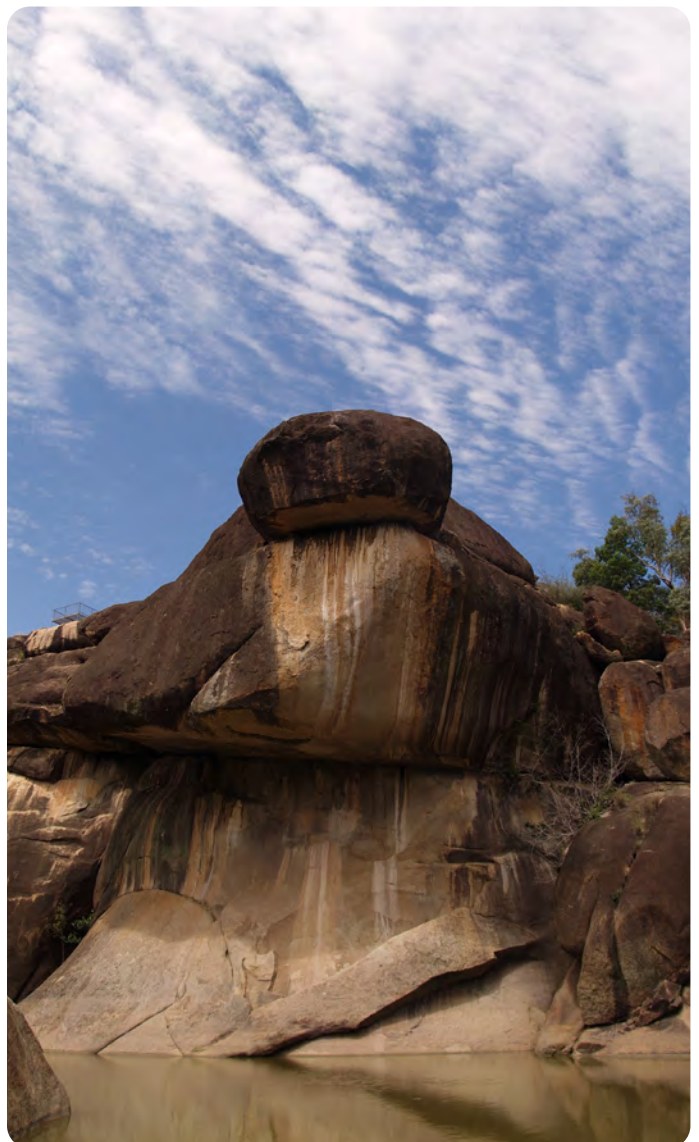
Cranky Rock Nature Reserve turn off is 5km east of Warialda, off the Gwydir Highway, the 3 km sealed road will take you all the way to Cranky Rock where you will find a jumble of giant boulders heaped in the most fantastic positions by a past volcanic upheaval, features include a suspension bridge, birdlife and wildlife sanctuary and a viewing platform. Facilities include picnic areas, a large shelter with free barbecues, public toilets, and a children's playground. There is a full-time caretaker and kiosk on site and should you wish to stay overnight or even longer there is a campground with powered/unpowered sites and hot showers available.

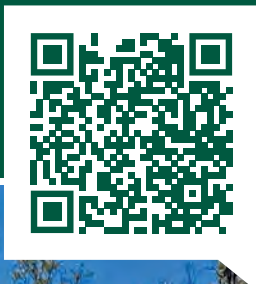
