



EMERGENCY PROCEDURES /

Medical Emergency

- CALL 000
- Address is Orange Showgrounds, Leeds Parade, Orange, NSW, 2800
- Nearest cross street is Phillip Street, Orange
- Then call First Aid on Mobile 0409 305 288 or UHF Channel 51
- Turn on your vehicle hazard lights day or night and alert your neighbours. In the event of a caravan or fifth wheeler without a tow vehicle present, please have someone stand in front of the RV until assistance arrives
- First aid will contact the Rally Warden who will direct the ambulance to the required site
- If you call an ambulance, you must ensure rally First Aid is called straight away.

Fire and/or Police Emergency

- CALL 000
- Address is Orange Showgrounds, Leeds Parade, Orange, NSW, 2800
- Nearest cross street is Phillip Street, Orange
- Then call the Rally Warden on mobile 0400 333 095 or UHF Channel 50
- Turn on your vehicle hazard lights day or night and alert your neighbours if safe to do so
- DO NOT move your vehicle unless instructed by the Rally Warden or Emergency Response Team (ERT).

If you discover a fire:

- R. Remove anyone from immediate danger
- A. Alert another person to raise the alarm
- C. Contain the fire by closing up the vehicle, remove power lead and cut off gas
- E. Extinguish the fire if safe to do so.

Gas Emergency

- Turn off the LP Gas container gas valve if safe to do so.
- · Turn on your vehicle's hazard lights day or night and alert your neighbours if it is safe to do so
- Evacuate the area for 30 metres around the leak (danger area)
- Ring 000 or 112 (from a mobile phone) from outside the danger area
- Contact the Rally Warden on 0400 333 095 or UHF Channel 50
- · Post a sentry to warn passer-by of the danger
- DO NOT move your vehicle unless instructed by the emergency services, Rally Warden, or Emergency Response Team (ERT)
- If cylinder catches alight (via the pressure valve) spray water onto the top half of the cylinder to keep cool and than gradually turn valve off or let cylinder vent (make sure that in doing this you are not putting yourself in danger).

Emergency Evacuation

On arrival at your site, you should familiarise yourself with the location of all Emergency Assembly Areas. They are marked with a no the Rally Site Map. Should an evacuation be necessary, proceed to the nearest and safest Emergency Assembly Area. You will be assisted by members of the Emergency Response Team (ERT) – please ensure you follow their directions.

Emergency evacuation and safety procedures are outlined on the Rally Noticeboards, and during the Member Orientation session on Sunday 5 October at 7pm in the Whitworth Building (1A).

CODE OF CONDUCT



The purpose of the code of conduct is to set out the standards of behaviour expected of members when attending a Rally. In agreeing to be part of the Rally, each member also agrees to adhere to these codes at all times.

Members must: Treat all people associated with the club, including members, volunteers, partners and external stakeholders with respect. Consider the welfare of the club's members at all times. Be honest at all times. Adhere to the Rally rules established by the club. Respect the immediate and local environment. Don't damage the Rally Site (intentionally or otherwise), don't remove any equipment without permission, don't enter a restricted area or promote any organisation other than CMCA, or act in a manner that may bring CMCA and/or its members into disrepute.

Uncooperative behaviour: A member who becomes uncooperative or unruly or disregards the Code of Conduct may be asked to leave the Rally Site. Failure to cooperate will result in the Police being called to assist. If this occurs, further action via the CMCA Constitution may be undertaken and a possible expulsion from the club may occur.

DOGS & OTHER PETS



ALL pets must be kept under control, AT ALL TIMES.

Pets must be wearing a collar whilst in public and be microchipped and registered. All pets must be on a lead, no longer than 2 metres, and under control, when in public places. Exercising your pet from a vehicle, including bicycles and scooters, is NOT permitted at any time, in fact it is against the law. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets and must carry "poop" bags, always, when walking their pets. Pet owners must not permit their pets to become or create a nuisance. Pets that tend to snap or bite should be muzzled when out of their RV. A maximum of two pets per RV is permitted.

DOGS & OTHER PETS CONTINUED...



Owners must ensure their pets are not annoying to other members and should not be left unattended in RVs or motor vehicles, where they can cause a nuisance to neighbours and fellow attendees. Pets will be allowed in the Dog-Friendly Eating Area (20) at the food court, but are prohibited from all other buildings, buses, seminars and normal food areas - the exception being accredited Guide and Assistance Animals (including companion animals).



GAS REFILLS

Visit the CMCA Shop in the Trade Hall (1B) to pay for your gas bottle refill. PLEASE DO NOT TAKE YOUR GAS BOTTLE INTO THE TRADE HALL. You will be given a label to write your name, phone number and site number on. Attach the label to your empty gas cylinder and take it to the Thermoshield Australia Maintenance Building (21) and leave it in the crate provided between 9am-10am. Collect your full gas bottle between 2.30pm-3.30pm from Tuesday 7 October to Friday 10 October. A hand trolley is available for use if required.

GENERATORS

Generators should have a noise level not exceeding 68dB. Generators must ONLY be run between 8am-4pm, with your neighbour's consent. Generators must not be run for more than two consecutive hours and not more than four hours per day.

If generators must be run outside the designated hours, then those members will need to consider relocation to a more appropriate site at the Rally after consultation with the Rally Manager (extended generator hours are available in a separate area of the site 8am-7pm). Members who insist on running generators outside the approved hours, without approval of the Rally Manager, may be asked to leave the Rally.

GREY WATER



Grey water may be trickle-fed onto the ground if you use a sock on the end of your hose as supplied in the Rally Bag. Please ensure you relocate the hose every day to safeguard against flooding the area and your grey water does not cause a problem to your neighbours.

No joining of cords is allowed unless by an approved device such as an Amphibian which must be at least 300mm off the ground. Cords can be tested by the Test & Tag Team located in the Trade Hall (1B) which is a free service supplied by CMCA to members at the Rally.





Two good blokes will make it a HAPPY HOUR to remember.


