Opening of CMCA Nyngan Van Park

The official opening of the Nyngan Van Park was held on Wednesday 30 October. Chair Nelson Crawshaw and his wife Sheri N98597 attended on behalf of CMCA. Nelson commented that the park had seen significant improvements since he stayed there a year ago.

Owner, Bruce Maynard, was also on site to welcome CMCA members and other park guests for the occasion. Nelson and Bruce said a few words and then unveiled the new plaque commemorating the event.

CMCA has managed the Van Park since April this year, and thanks to Col and Eva Burgess N83353 (custodians for that entire time) the park is looking great. Bruce has plans for more improvements in the coming years as his budget allows. Next will be clearing to enlarge some of the powered sites, expansion of the unpowered camping area, construction of an off-leash dog area, and construction of a roof over the happy hour area (including a brick pizza oven).
